Background

• To determine the state of the field, The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation awarded the Wake Forest University School of Medicine a \$400,000 grant to assess the scope and adequacy of adult day services in the United States. This national study is the first of such magnitude.

Scope of Work


- Conduct a census of adult day service providers
- Survey all providers
- Identify gaps in the current service delivery system
 - availability gaps
 - utilization gaps











Contract Out - % of Centers
















